We just finished our series on "Abraham: The Father of Faith." We learned about the history of Judaism and Christianity and how Abraham was a man of faith. We also learned about how he stumbled. Our next sermon series is entitled, "From Saul to Paul." We begin with the conversion of the Apostle Paul called, "Blinded by the Light."

I had someone ask me why I am doing a six week series instead of doing individual sermons. My answer is that many times Pastors



preach on their favorite topics rather than gradually moving through the word of God. Moving slowly through the scriptures is often called "expository preaching." It means that the original context of the scripture is explained and then application is made. If we don't fully understand what was happening, we may take the scripture out of context. "God wants everyone to be healed," "God wants everyone to be rich," "America, love it or leave it" type sermons are popular, but out of context with Scripture.



I was watching "Religulous" by Bill Maher the other day. The movie is a documentary that mocks Christianity and Christians along with other religions. Bill Maher is an agnostic or atheist who hates religion and particularly Christianity. He interviewed dozens of Christian leaders who had very little knowledge of the Bible and made a mockery of them for his movie. I have found that many Christians, including Christian leaders, are biblically illiterate. In focusing on expository preaching, we begin to understand what we believe, why we believe it, and how it can change our lives. Please join in as we study the exciting life of the former "Christ-Killer," the Apostle Paul.



With that being said, beginning the first Sunday of October, I will be leading a Sunday School class on discipleship. This class will encompass spiritual disciplines, family worship, and foundations of the faith. This class will help us to build stronger roots as individual Christians and as a church body. It will also enable us to identify false doctrines and stand in confidence and know what we believe as a church.
